REX and the Rockies—what to expect in natural gas supply, storage and transportation issues

DENVER – The IPAMS Natural Gas Committee will provide a look at natural gas supply, storage and transportation issues that affect the Intermountain West as part of their monthly Natural Gas Roundtable Luncheon Series.

- **Transportation Outlook:** The Rockies Express Pipeline (REX) continues to be the big news. Learn about the flow dynamics of mid-continent and mid-western pipelines and how the Rockies Express West expansion will impact price trends once the pipe hits Lebanon/Clarington.
- **Current Trends:** Panelists will also discuss current issues natural gas shippers and producers should consider as REX nears completion: price differentials, meter and pipe constraints, competition with mid-continent production, etc. Learn what consumers should be aware of once REX volumes reach different pressure limitations.
